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I. Performance and Financial Position

1. Performance

During the fiscal year under review, the business environment surrounding the Hogy Medical Group remained severe. In the healthcare sector, soaring prices of materials and utilities put pressure on business management, in addition to which, problems such as labor shortages and increasing labor costs have emerged since full-scale reforms to doctors' working practices were implemented in April 2024.

Under these circumstances, the Hogy Medical Group aggressively developed high-value-added products that contribute to medical safety as well as operational efficiency and other improvements to hospital management. The performance of Premium Kit, our most important strategic product, was particularly noteworthy. Premium Kit has been warmly evaluated by customers as a high-value-added product that significantly reduces the time and effort required by customers before, during, and after surgery and ensures medical safety during surgery. Accordingly, it has generated increases in sales since its launch. Sales of Premium Kit grew substantially during the fiscal year under review as well. On the other hand, sales of nonwoven fabric products continued to decrease.

As a result, consolidated net sales for the year amounted to \$39,138 million, up 0.1% from the previous year. Sales of surgical kit products rose 2.0%, to \$26,018 million, of which Premium Kit sales climbed 17.7%, to \$13,326 million. In terms of cost of sales, although depreciation expenses decreased and productivity improved, the cost of sales ratio nevertheless came to 67.8% (up 1.2 points from the previous year) due to the impact of the persistently weak yen, the appropriate valuation and disposal of inventory, and rising costs of raw materials, among other factors. Selling, general, and administrative (SG&A) expenses decreased overall thanks to cost containment efforts. As a result, operating profit declined 8.6%, to \$3,810 million.

During the fiscal year under review, as part of structural reforms, the Company reviewed its idle asset holdings and non-core businesses, resulting in the recording of write-downs on investment securities and shares of affiliated companies, as well as an additional provisions for allowances for doubtful accounts. Due to an increase in the tax burden rate accompanying the recording of these write-downs and other factors, for which tax effects cannot be recognized, profit attributable to owners of parent declined 45.8% to ¥1,520 million.

Forecast for FY2025

The official medical fees revisions implemented in fiscal 2024 resulted in a large positive revision of 0.88% for the core portion, but with material costs, labor costs, and other items continuing to rise, the business environment for medical institutions is expected to remain severe. Improving both medical safety and productivity of hospital operations, as well as the sustainability of the medical care system itself, are expected to become social priorities.

In terms of sales activities, in Japan we will actively develop proposals for improving management, such as reducing workload, primarily through our Premium Kit, in order to address issues such as productivity improvement and labor shortages at medical facilities, especially advanced acute care hospitals and acute care hospitals, and contribute to solving these issues. By promoting the sales reforms that we have been implementing since the previous fiscal year and widening the range of kit components, we will expand the number of procedures that can be performed and improve unit prices. Overseas, our sales subsidiary Hogy Medical Asia Pacific Pte. Ltd. in Singapore and our Indonesian sales sub-subsidiary P.T. Hogy Medical Sales Indonesia will actively introduce our products to major hospitals in Singapore and Indonesia and other ASEAN countries.

In production activities, we will work to further improve productivity in addition to raising capacity utilization rates through sales growth. Considering the decline in depreciation expenses, we expect the cost of sales ratio to improve.

Concurrently, we will continue to carry out structural reforms with a view to achieving sustainable growth in the medium to long term. SG&A expenses are expected to increase due to higher R&D expenditures aimed at



strengthening product appeal, as well as ongoing investment in human resources and digital transformation to enhance sales capabilities and boost productivity across the Company.

In light of the aforementioned circumstances, our consolidated performance forecasts for the next fiscal year are as follows.

2. Financial Position

(1) Assets, liabilities, and net assets

As of March 31, 2025, total assets amounted to ¥97,895 million, down ¥2,146 million from March 31, 2024.

During the period, total current assets rose ¥1,174 million, to ¥44,200 million. Factors included a ¥2,586 million increase in cash and bank deposits, a ¥1,320 million decrease in notes and accounts receivable, a ¥488 million increase in inventories, and a ¥675 million decrease in accrued consumption taxes and other. Within fixed assets, property, plant and equipment increased ¥50 million, to ¥45,763 million, reflecting an increase of ¥2,016 million in buildings and structures largely due to the fact that the increase stemming from expansion of the P.T. Hogy Indonesia factory exceeded the decrease due to depreciation, a decrease of ¥2,989 million largely due to depreciation of equipment and vehicles, and a ¥984 million increase in construction in progress. Intangibles decreased ¥118 million, to ¥377 million, mainly due to ¥196 million in depreciation. Investments and other assets decreased ¥3,253 million, to ¥7,554 million, mainly due to a ¥3,230 million decrease in investment securities stemming from the partial sale of, and write-downs on, equity holdings, as well as a ¥186 increase in allowances for doubtful accounts. As a result, total fixed assets ended the period at ¥53,694 million.

At fiscal year-end, total liabilities amounted to ¥23,562 million, up ¥9,640 million. Current liabilities increased ¥2,140 million to ¥10,381 million, mainly reflecting a ¥939 million increase in income taxes payable, a ¥906 million increase in accrued consumption taxes, and ¥333 million increase in other accounts payable. Long-term liabilities increased ¥7,500 million to ¥13,180 million, mainly reflecting a ¥10,000 million increase due to long-term borrowings, a ¥1,999 million decrease due to repayment of long-term borrowings, and a ¥642 million decrease in deferred tax liabilities due to the partial sale of equity holdings.

Net assets at year-end totaled ¥74,332 million, down ¥11,787 million. Factors included an increase due to ¥1,520 million in profit attributable to owners of parent, a ¥1,833 million decrease due to distributions from retained earnings, a decrease of ¥1,264 million due to write-downs on other securities reflecting the partial sale of equity holdings, and a ¥1,267 million increase in currency translation adjustments. In addition, based on the resolution of the Board of Directors meeting held on July 17, 2024, we repurchased and retired 2,721,500 shares of our stock, resulting in a ¥10,899 million decrease in retained earnings.

As a result, the equity ratio dipped to 75.9%, down from 86.81% from March 31, 2024.

(2) Cash flows

Cash and cash equivalents at the end of the year stood at ¥21,334 million, up ¥2,710 million from a year earlier. This reflected cash flow factors described below.



Cash flows from operating activities

Net cash provided by operating activities amounted to ¥11,555 million, compared to ¥7,117 million in the previous year. Factors in this result included ¥2,934 million in income before income taxes, ¥5,741 million in depreciation, the recording ¥1,109 million in gains on the sale of investment, ¥529 million in impairment losses, and ¥1,090 million in write-downs on investment securities, a ¥1,437 million decrease in notes and accounts receivable, a ¥906 million increase in accrued consumption taxes and other, a ¥675 million decrease in accrued consumption taxes and other, and ¥737 million in income taxes paid.

Cash flows from investing activities

Net cash used in investing activities totaled ¥3,917 million, compared to ¥3,262 million in the previous year. Main factors included ¥5,230 million in purchase of property, plant and equipment and ¥1,303 million in sale of investment securities.

Cash flows from financing activities

Net cash used in financing activities was ¥5,455 million, compared to ¥3,892 million in the previous year. Main factors included ¥10,000 million from long-term borrowings, ¥1,999 million in repayments of long-term borrowings, ¥11,623 million from the repurchase of the Company's own shares, and ¥1,833 million in dividends paid.

For the next fiscal year, we expect net cash provided by operating activities of around ¥7,860 million; net cash used in investing activities of around ¥5,280 million, mainly due to purchases of property, plant and equipment; and net cash used in financing activities of around ¥3,720 million, mainly influenced by repayments of long-term borrowings and payments of dividends.
